



Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Permits Needed to Construct Chester Soccer Stadium

Permits currently under review:

- **National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) application PAI0123-08004**
For control of earthmoving during construction and proper management of stormwater on the site after construction is complete. ***Proposed Phase 1 work:*** Construct relocated combined sewer overflow (CSO), river bulkhead and stadium on stadium parcel.
- **Water Obstruction and Encroachment application E23-472**
Floodplain encroachments related to the relocation of the CSO; rehabilitation of existing bulkhead and construction of new bulkhead along the river; filling in 0.8 acres of wetlands in the vicinity of the existing CSO; construction and maintenance of 3,200 ft. of trail; and stabilization of 500 ft. of existing shoreline.

Permits and approvals that will be needed in the future:

- **Part 2 Water Quality Management Permit**
For construction of the combined sewer pipe being rerouted on the site to the new CSO location.
- **Act 537 Sewage Planning**
Approval of the sewage flows that will be generated by the project for connection to the city's sanitary sewer system.
- **NPDES Permit Amendment**
For future phases of the overall project. As design of future phases is completed, approval of an amended NPDES will be needed for additional erosion control and post-construction stormwater management on other areas of the project site.

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Cleanup Plan under PA Act 2: DEP approval will be needed for the proposed cleanup as part of the Land Recycling Program. The Notice of Intent to remediate (NIR) is the first step in bringing a site through DEP's Act 2 process. Act 2 ensures that previously contaminated industrial sites are safe and protective of public health and the environment for the intended future use of the property. A number of reports are then submitted to DEP for review and approval, including a Remedial Investigation Report, the proposed Cleanup Plan, and the Final Report. If DEP approves the Final Report, the developer will obtain a release of liability from DEP for the known contamination on the site.
